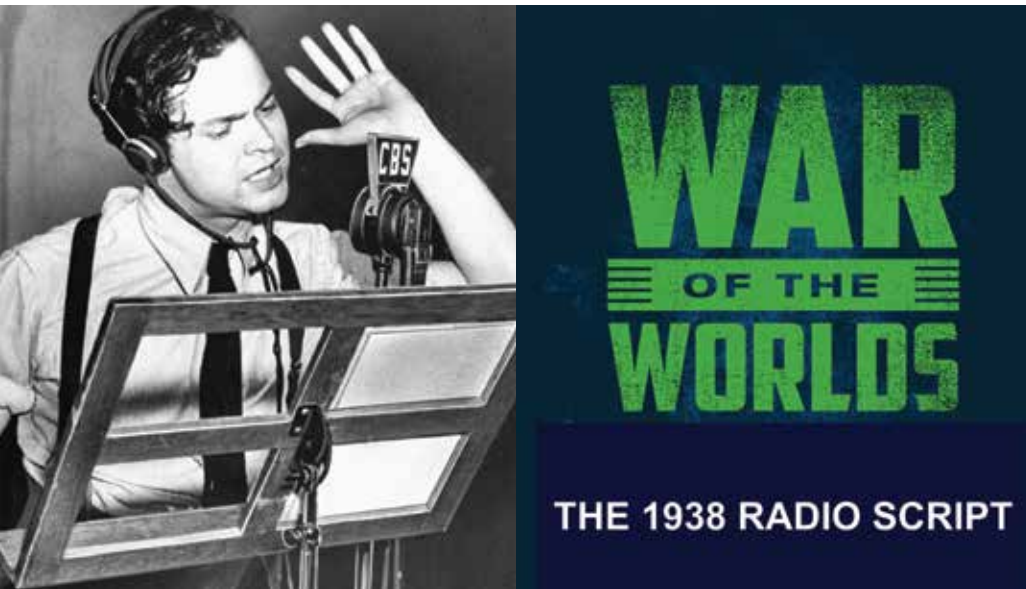

Cost: \$2.95 payable to Broadway on Demand at time of streaming

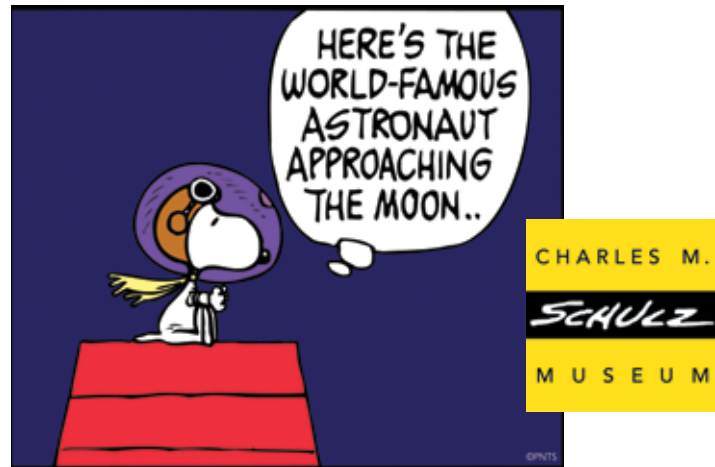
