A visit to the Churchville One-Room Schoolhouse, a National Register of Historic Places site, is an interactive experience that takes children back to the early 1900s when local farm children attended school in this one-room structure. Students meet the Schoolmarm, and learn 19th century lessons with McGuffey readers and slates. Spelling bees, recitation, and math facts are included as well as recess with old-fashioned games (time permitting). Programs are available year-round!
